ABA for Meaningful Change

An Introduction to Applied Behavior Analysis

It has been said that the goal of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) is to create a meaningful and positive change in the life of the individual. This workshop will look at the various ways in which we use ABA to create a full and happy life. Parents of children with Autism Spectrum Disorder and related disabilities will learn the basic principles of Applied Behavior Analysis and discuss its use at home and in school. Topics will include the ABC's of behavior, the importance of positive reinforcement, delivering effective consequences, and utilizing timeout. This workshop will also touch on Discrete Trial Training (DTT), faultless learning, and verbal developmental milestones.

The goal of this program is to provide families with strategies for better managing behavior at home and to introduce the principles of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) in a friendly, collaborative, and inclusive environment. This workshop is open to parents and caregivers and is appropriate for families with preschool and elementary aged children.
